

District and Regional Rates for 2004/2005

The district rates are struck by individual district councils to meet the costs of local services. District councils strike a domestic rate and non domestic rate.

Domestic and non-domestic regional rates are struck each year, by the Department of Finance and Personnel, to help pay for central services such as health, education, roads and transport.

Individual rate bills are calculated by multiplying the property's net annual value (NAV) by the district and regional rate total.
